- 3. No copyrighted artwork, characters, or brand names. Entries containing any copyrighted material will not be considered during the review process.
- 4. Submissions will be reviewed and approved for content suitable for schools and will be viewed by members of the community. Keep this in consideration when writing or designing your submissions.

Submission Requirements:

- 1. The entry deadline is Friday, October 4th, 2024 by 4:30 pm. Entries may be turned in to the school office or delivered to: 1135 Lincoln St, Red Bluff, CA
- 2. Entries must include the following information: full name, school, grade, and phone number. Put entry form on the back of poster and/or the last page of an essay. Contact information must be on the submission form or will not be considered.
- 3. Essays should be no longer than 250 words and submitted on letter-sized page ($8\frac{1}{2} \ge 11$ inches); can be handwritten or typed. Posters must be no smaller than $11 \ge 17$ inches and no larger than $22 \ge 28$ inches.
- 4. Students may submit both a poster and essay on a single form as long as information matches on both entries. Multiple entry forms will not be considered.
